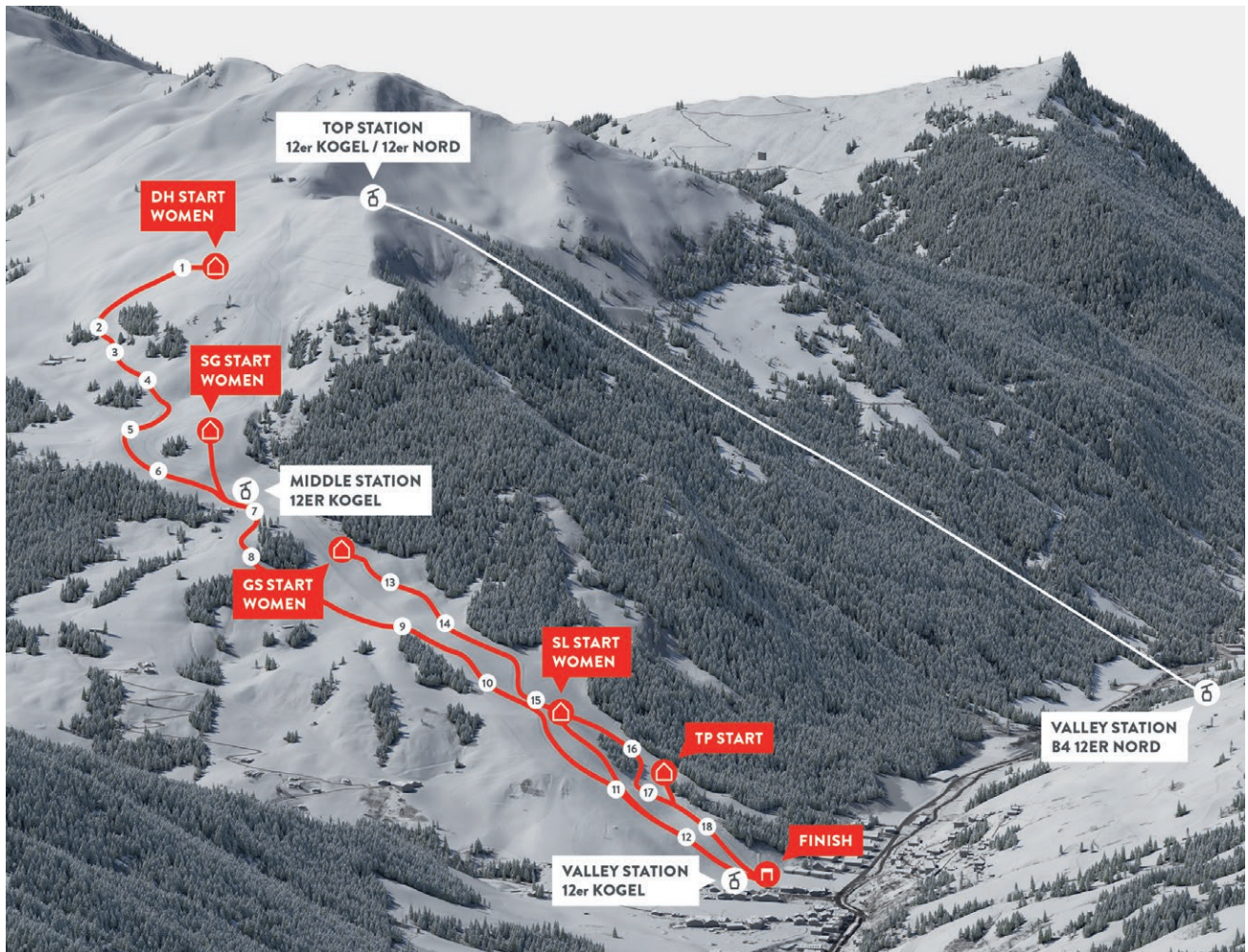

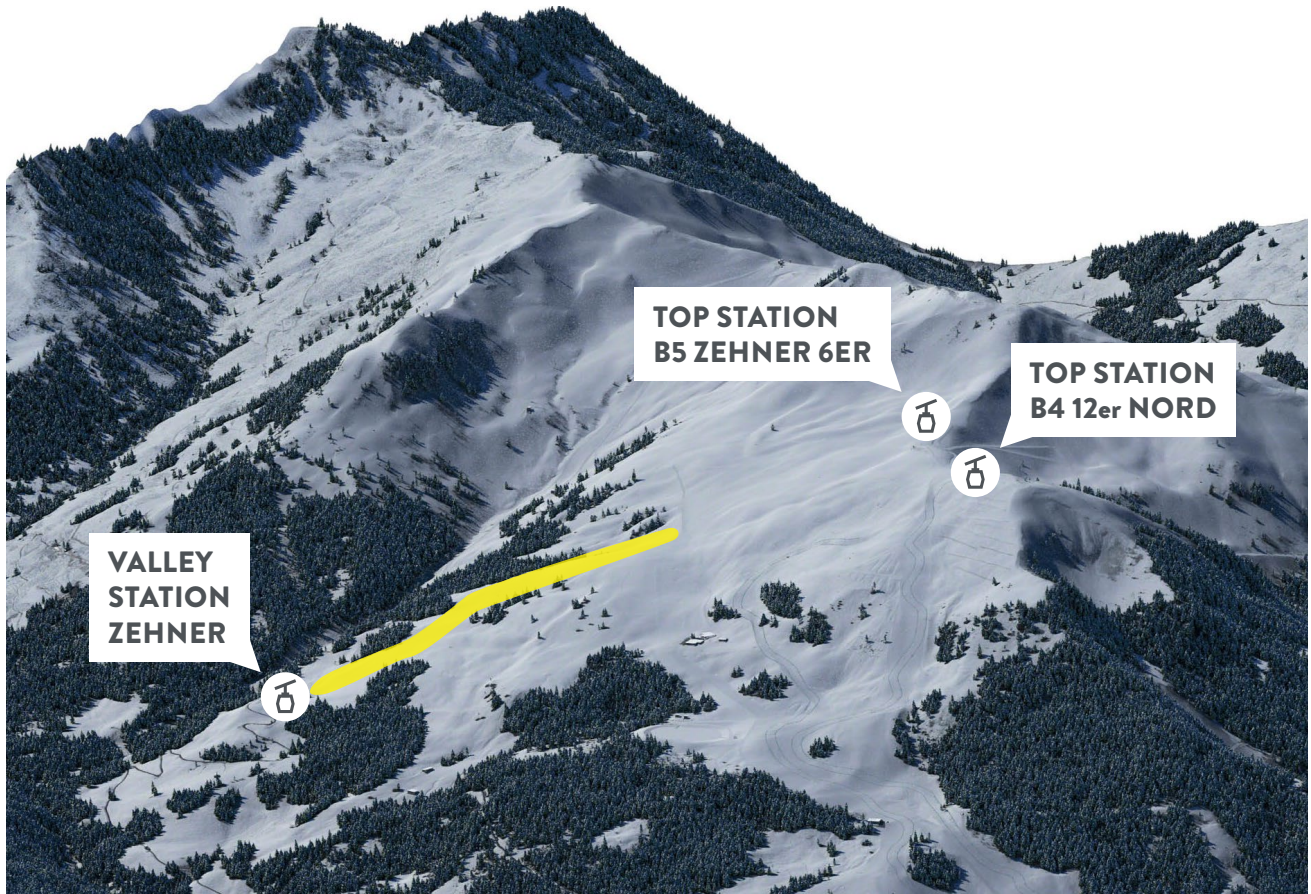

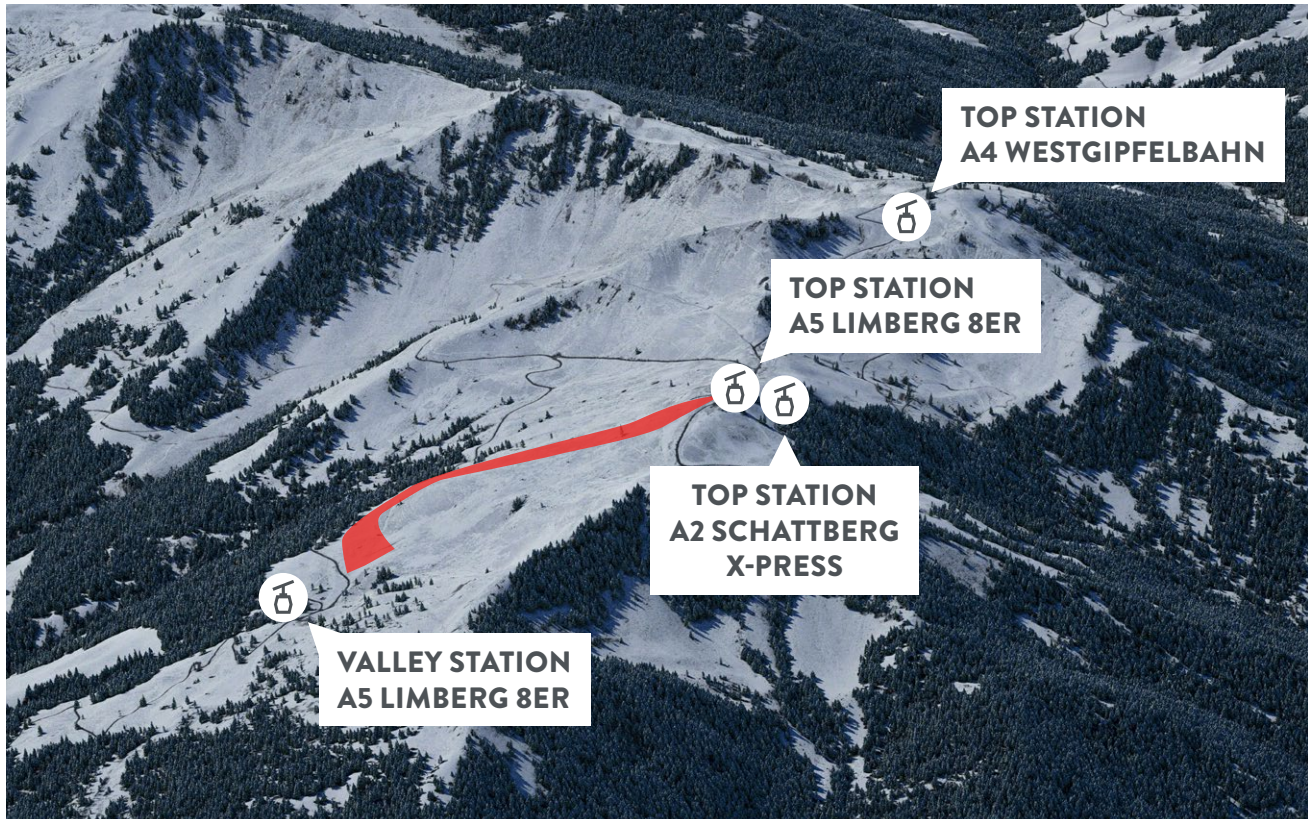

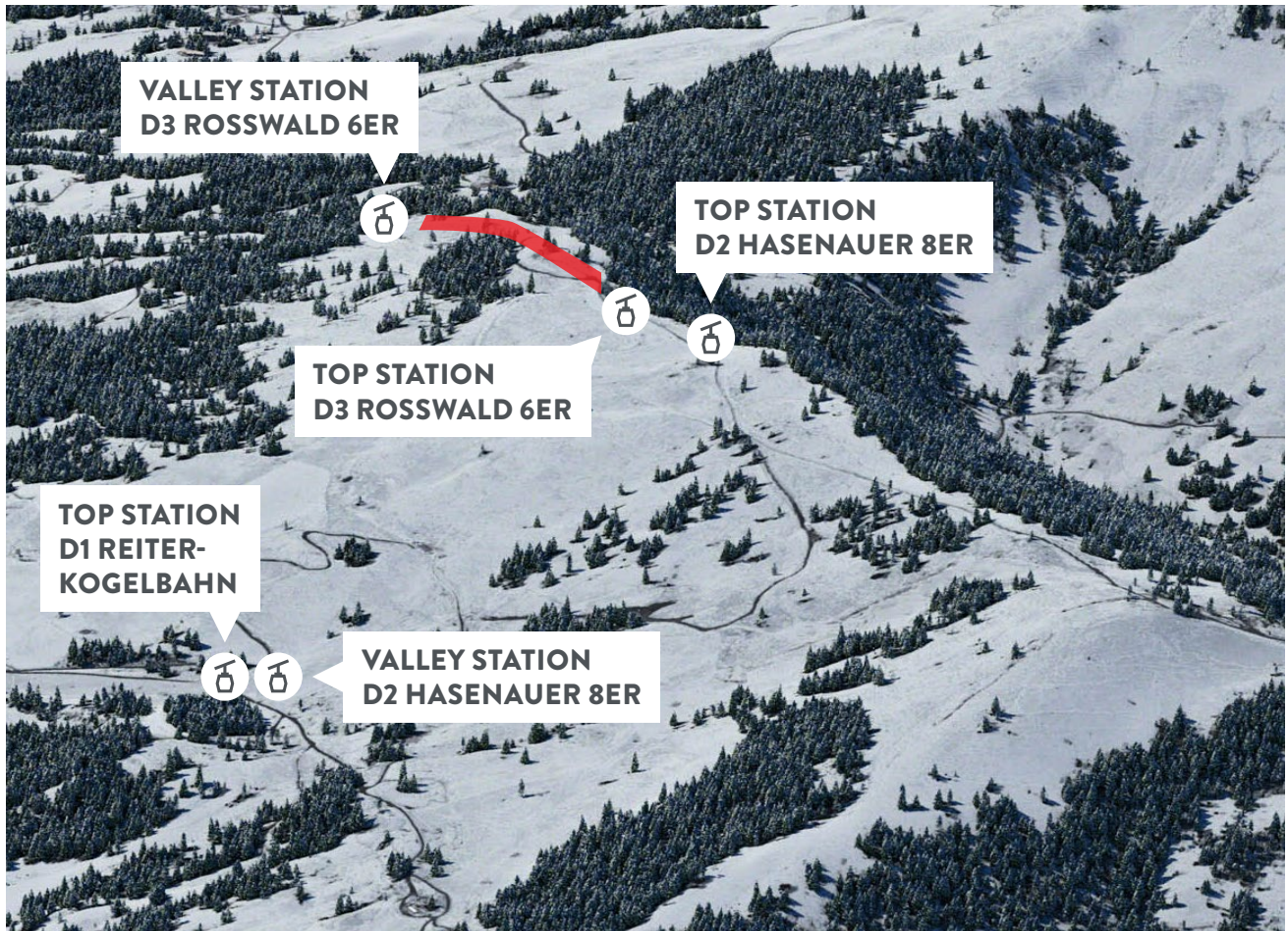

6. FIS ALPINE WORLD SKI CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES

6.1. Eligibility and Citizenship of the Competitors

To be eligible for entry in the FIS World Championships the competitor must be a citizen of the nation of which National Ski Association he has a licence of and prove this with a valid passport (ICR 203).

6.2. Number of Participants and Officials

According to the FIS Rules for the Organisation of FIS World Championships (WSC Rules) article 8.3 the maximum number of participants from each nation and the qualification levels shall be:

WSC Rules art. 8.5 No more than 24 competitors with a maximum of 14 of either gender in the Alpine events plus the competitors according to art. 8.2.

Minimum requirements:

Slalom/Giant Slalom/Team Combined (SL run)/ Mixed Team Parallel: FIS points in one of the four events (DH, SL, GS, SG) on the valid FIS points list. Downhill/Super G/Team Combined (DH run): Maximum 80 FIS points in the event according to the valid FIS points list.

*In the event that there are more than approximately 120 entered competitors for the Giant Slalom and Slalom, a qualification race will take place as part of these races.

6.3. Number of Participants in each individual Event

According to the WSC Rules art. 8.3: In each single event no more than 4 competitors per National Ski Association plus the competitors according to art. 8.2, are entitled to start.

FIS Alpine World Ski Championships and Olympic Winter Games Rules and Precisions for the Team Combined (TC)

WSC Rules art. 8.5.1 Mixed Team Parallel Alpine (TP): Maximum number of Nations allowed to participate in the Mixed Team Parallel is 16. The best 15 nations on the World Cup Nations Cup standings after the last World Cup race prior to the FIS Alpine World Ski Championships are automatically qualified for the Mixed Team Parallel. If the host nation is not in the best 15 nations, it is qualified as the 16th nation.

If 15 (or less) automatically qualified nations from the World Cup Nations Cup standing are entered (including the host nation), the nation(s) with lowest PWSL ranks result, based on the calculation made by adding the PWSL ranks of the best four (4) athletes (two (2) women and two (2) men) entered for the Mixed Team Parallel will have the possibility to start until there are 16 nations entered. The regulations for the Mixed Team Parallel are published on the FIS Website under “Rules for the Mixed Team Parallel”.

6.4. Team Officials

WSC Rules art. 9.1 the maximum number of team officials, medical and technical personnel per national team shall be:

WSC Rules art. 9.1.2 the number of Official per gender:

*Medical personnel includes physicians, physiotherapists, etc.

Art. 9.1.4 Transferable accreditations for Team Officials up to 50% of the above number of team official accreditations may be exchanged during the Championships in order to accommodate different coaches and support staff in the different events. The accreditation card of the departed official must be returned to the LOC in exchange for a new one.

Access passes to the Team and Restricted Areas will be provided to the teams to distribute internally, based on the above quotas.

Art. 9.1.5 NSA President and Secretary General may be registered by each NSA with the team entry for each of the disciplines. Their registration does not count as part of the total quota.

Art. 9.2 Access to the competition courses

Access to the competition course(s) is defined by the Jury and communicated at the Team Captain's Meetings. Persons granted access to the competition course(s) and restricted areas shall be provided with an additional access card or other agreed identification.

6.5. Deadlines for Entries

Entries will be accepted from the Ski Association of each country in accordance with the FIS quotas and rules.

Please submit team entries through the FIS Online Entry System at www.fis-ski.com. National Ski Associations must submit their team numbers and names according to the FIS Alpine World Ski Championship rules.

6.6. Anti-Doping and Medical Rules

According to the WSC Rules art. 17.9: If any question or protest arises as to the gender of the athlete, FIS shall assume responsibility for taking the necessary steps to determine the gender of the athlete (ICR art. 221.5)

Art. 17.3 Anti-Doping control of all events is compulsory.

Art. 17.6 the FIS Anti-Doping Rules compiled in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code define all by-laws concerning anti-doping controls.

WSC Rules art. 13.4 before 14 JAN 2025 (12.4.1 Provisional team selection), a National Ski Association may change their accommodation reservation by a maximum of 20% of the total nights without payment of a penalty (additional requirements are subject to availability).

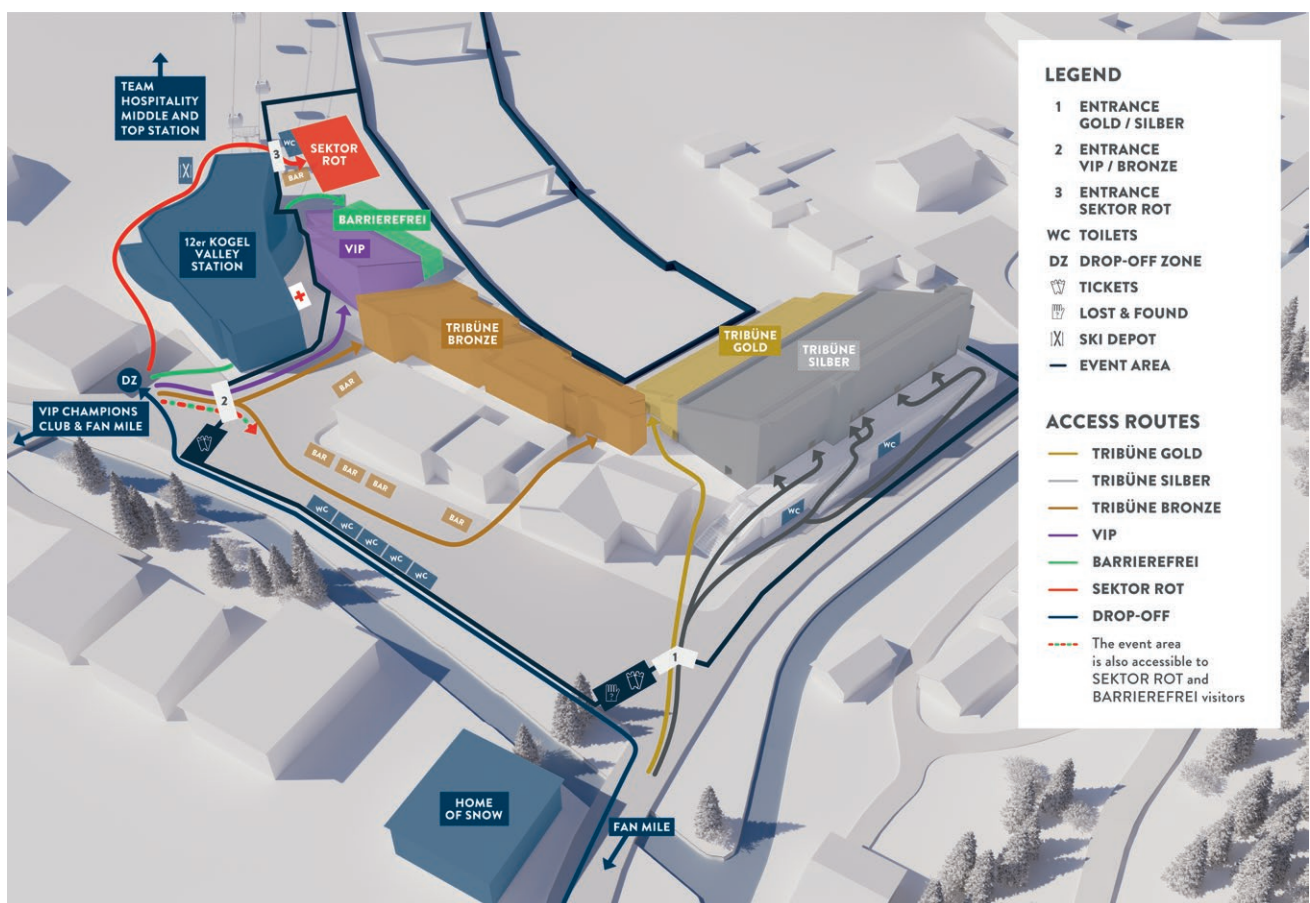
The LOC's terms for payment of accommodation will apply to athletes, who are not qualified for free accommodation, as well as for athletes who are qualified for free accommodation, but wish to extend their stay and for team officials.

If this information is not communicated by the published deadlines before the World Ski Championships, the Organising Committee has the right to invoice the costs occurred for cancelled accommodation to the National Ski Association concerned.

Teams or people who register late and do not observe the published deadlines have no right for the reservation or the payment of accommodation expenses and will be subject to payment of cancelled accommodation. Cancellation fees will be communicated later on.

8.2. Lift Access

During training and competition, priority access is given to the competitors, coaches, team personnel and officials on all lifts serving the respective runs. Follow the signs.

8.3. Course Access

Access to the competition course(s) is defined by the Jury and passes are distributed at the Race Office/Team Captains Meeting.

8.4. Team Hospitality

The team hospitality areas are for the exclusive use of the teams. Athletes and their staff are allowed to enter only on the days they participate in a race. Food and beverages will be provided before and during the races in the two team hospitality areas. The team hospitalities will be located at the top station/12er Treff Bar and in the middle station garage of the 12er KOGEL (See the maps above).

For a smooth process, the team hospitalities are assigned as follows:

- Speed races women: Team Hospitality Middle Station garage
- Speed races men: Team Hospitality 12er Treff and Top Station garage
- Technical races women and men: Team Hospitality Middle Station garage

8.5. Ski Preparation and Waxing Facilities

Each team will be allocated one or more ski waxing rooms depending on the number of athletes and the team size. The ski preparation and waxing facilities will be located directly at the “12er NORD” in Hinterglemm. For its use, a deposit will be charged by the Organising Committee. These rooms are managed by the Race Office.

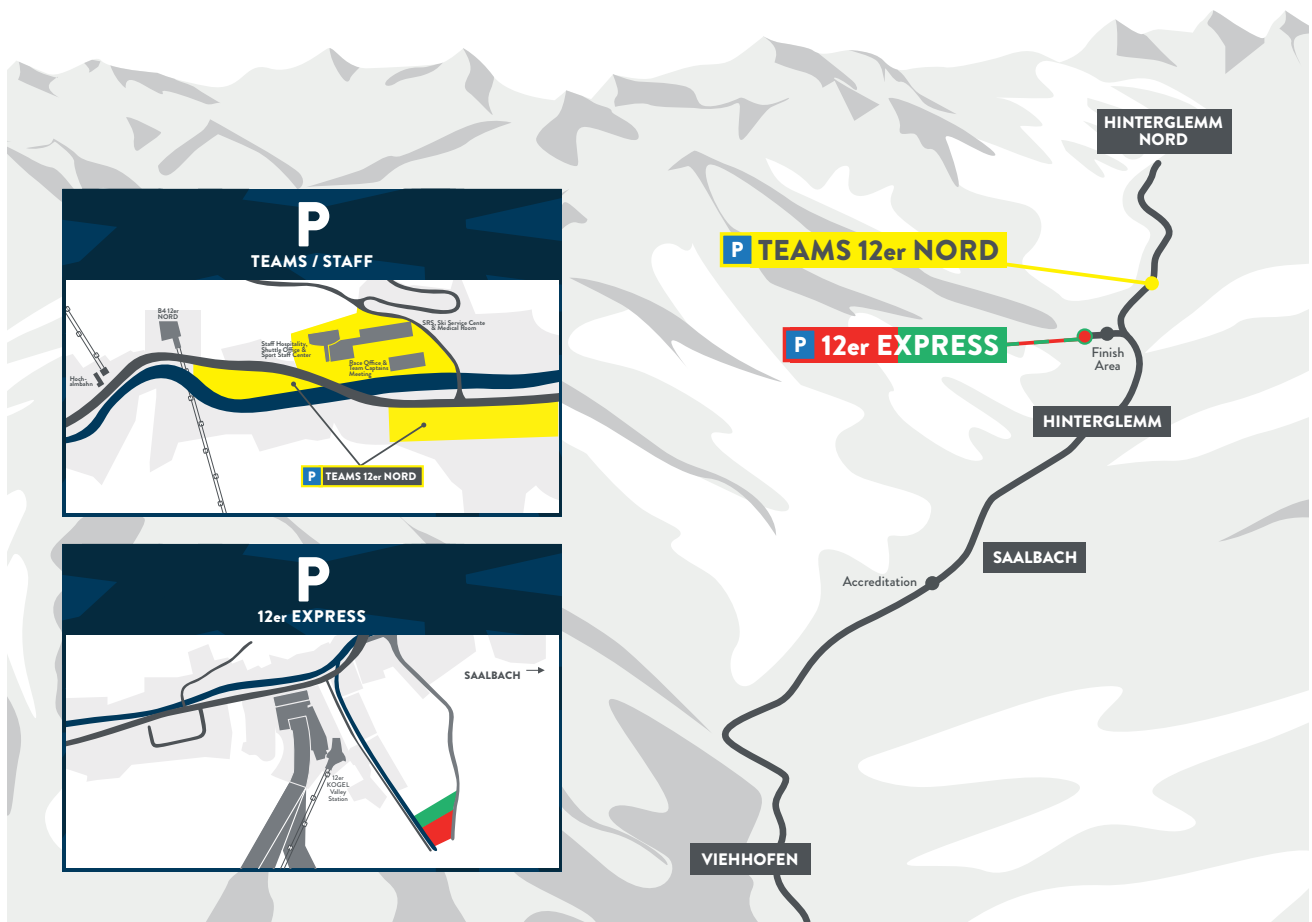

8.6. Parking for Teams

In the racing areas, the number of allocated parking lots will depend on the team size. Parking passes at the “12er Kogel Nord” will be given to the Team Captains at the Accreditation center. Parking passes near the “12er Kogel” are very limited due to the small number of parking spaces available. In the area in front of the ‘12er Kogel Nord’ run and the ‘12er Kogel’ run, there will be ‘drop off’ zones where equipment can be unloaded and people can be dropped off. Parking or long stays are not permitted in this area. Access will not be granted without a pass.



Due to limited parking facilities, please form carpools and use as few cars as possible.

8.7. Team Captains Meeting

The first Team Captains Meeting will be held at the “12er NORD” (**Glemmtaler Landesstraße 471, 5754 Hinterglemm**) each day before race day and official training day.

We kindly request that one representative from each team attend on-site, additional representatives and media should join the meeting online. There are a total of 150 seats available for team representatives, to ensure that there is sufficient capacity, we ask a maximum of 3 coaches for the speed races and 2 coaches for the technical races.

The first Team Captains Meeting will take place on Monday, 3 FEB: Women at 17:00 – Men at 18:00.

8.8. Accreditation

Team registration takes place via the FIS Entry System. The accreditation badges will be handed out collectively to the team captains at the Accreditation Center. The accreditation centre is located in the Saalbach Hinterglemm Tourism Office, the address is **Glemmtaler Landesstraße 550, 5753 Saalbach.**

Every NSA should have a person responsible for collecting all badges and passes to their team in order to minimize the number of people at the Accreditation Center.

Accreditation datas will be collected through the FIS entries only.

Accreditation requests of all SRS staff must be submitted by the corresponding company, not by the NSA.

Accreditation can only be issued in accordance with the quota regulations. Up to 50% of the above number of Alpine team official accreditations may be exchanged during the championships in order to accommodate different coaches and support staff in the different events.

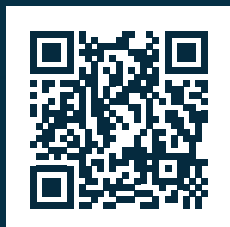
